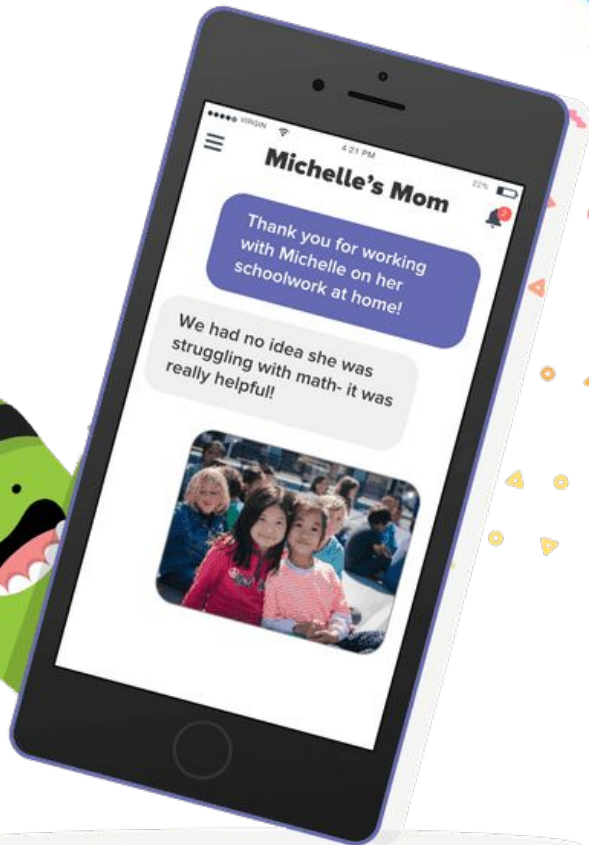

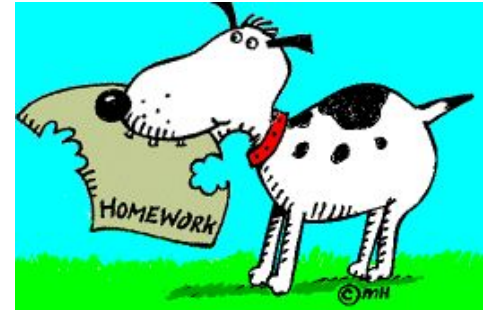

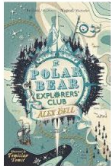

Frozen Kingdoms Home learning

1. Use the internet and other source materials to sketch and label a diagram of the Earth. Include the equator, Prime Meridian, lines of latitude and longitude, Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn and the polar regions.
2. Research and record the characteristics of each of the following climate zones: polar, temperate, desert, tropical and equatorial. Give examples of places within each climate zone.
3. Polar landscapes have many interesting natural features, including icebergs, glaciers, mountains, ice fields, tundra and boreal forests. Record a definition and description of each feature in a table.
- 4a. The Arctic is rich in natural resources, including oil, gas, wood, freshwater and hydropower. Draw a mind map to write a short description of each.
- 4b. Which of these natural resources are used, and which are barely untapped?
5. Many people are concerned about the impact of climate change on polar regions. Gather evidence to find the answers to the following questions:
 - What is global warming?
 - What is climate change?
 - What are four causes of global warming?
 - What is the impact of climate change on the planet?
 - What is the impact of climate change on wildlife?
 - What are your thoughts and feelings about climate change?

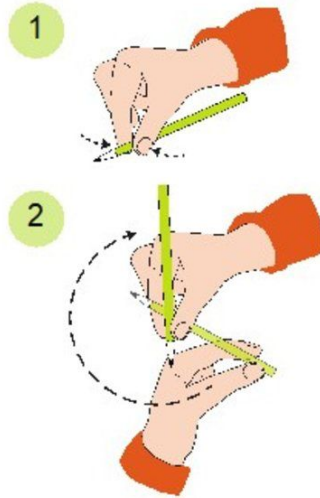


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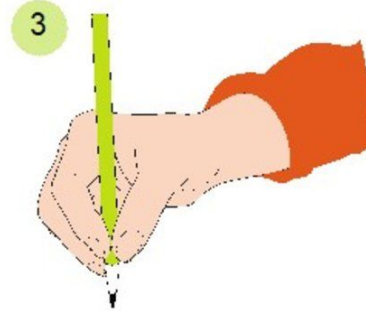


THE TRIPOD PENCIL GRIP

Both right and left handed children should be encouraged to use the tripod grip which allows the pen/pencil to be held securely whilst allowing controlled movements of the pen/pencil nib.



- 1) Grip the pencil with your index finger and thumb with the nib pointing away.
- 2) With your free hand, spin the pencil from underneath.
- 3) Use your middle finger to support the underside of the pencil.



Clear, legible

key!

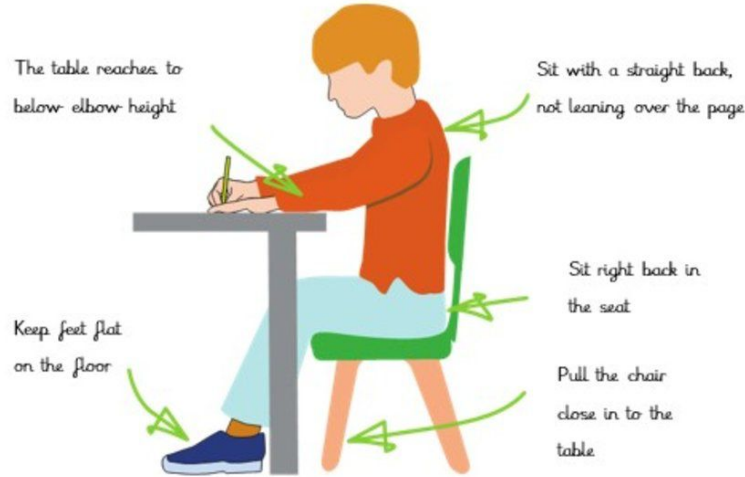


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Correct posture and pencil grip for handwriting

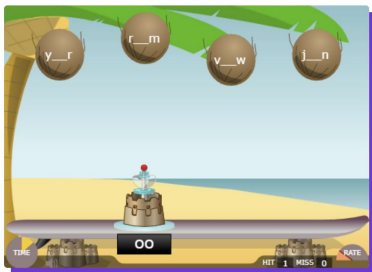
