

Uniform Policy at Sherborne Primary

Introduction

We believe that a school uniform is important:

- It looks smart
- Contributes to a sense of belonging and community
- Gives a common purpose
- Makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance and can help to reduce incidents of bullying
- Fosters a feeling of pride
- Is designed with health and safety in mind

We ask that all children wear the uniform and encourage them to maintain a good standard of clean and tidy dress in school.

Sherborne Primary School Uniform:

All Sherborne Primary pupils must wear uniform and have a PE kit in school for PE lessons.

- EYFS and KS1 bring in a suitable PE kit / KS2 arrive in PE Kit on PE days

School Uniform

The colour for our sweatshirts / cardigans are bottle green with the school logo (sweatshirts / cardigans with logos are purely optional to enable parents / carers to purchase cheaper items), white collared shirt (these can include the school logo, but is again optional) and grey or black trousers, shorts or skirts. In summer pupils are welcome to wear green check gingham dresses. Shoes must be black and practical for school use (no open toes or sling backs).

Please send a note if a child is to be excused from any sporting activity for any reason.

Kitz also has PE bags, book bags and sun hats available to purchase if required.

Accessories and Jewellery

Hair accessories such as slides, ribbons, bobbles, etc, should be fairly simple and in school colours. Hair style should avoid being extreme in style and we ask that children do not have their hair dyed/coloured. Children must not wear makeup.

Children are allowed to wear one pair of plain, small stud earrings in the lobe of each ear. These must be removed by the child before PE lessons. If they are unable to remove earrings themselves, please provide your child with plasters or microporous tape which they can use to cover up their own earrings before PE lessons.

Watches may be worn but these must be removed for any PE activity. Discrete items of jewellery which have an important religious significance may be worn – but only after a letter has been written by parents asking for permission. No other jewellery is allowed.

The role of class teachers and support staff

- Staff will remind all children to wear school uniform and dress in the appropriate way – this includes rules applying to hair styles, jewellery, make up, etc .
- Staff will speak to individual children who do not adhere to this policy and, if necessary, to their parents.
- Persistent refusal to comply with this policy will lead to referral to the Head of School / Deputy Head of School

The role of the Head of School

- The Head of School has a duty to enforce the school uniform and dress code throughout the school as part of the day to day running of the school.
- The Head of School will follow up any persistent nonadherence to this policy.

The role of the Academy Committee / Trust (SAST)

- It is the committee's / SAST responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities.
- SAST / local governing body will support the Head of School in implementing the school uniform policy.

The role of parents

- All parents / carers who send their children to our school should support the School Uniform Policy.
- Parents should endeavour to send their child to school with the appropriate clothing each day.
- Parents should ensure that all uniform items are clearly labelled.

The role of pupils

- To wear the correct uniform provided by their parents/carers to school to show they belong to their school community.
- To take pride and responsibility in how they present themselves.

Sherborne Primary completely understands that the cost of a uniform can be challenging and we are always here to help in a multitude of ways. Our support includes the option to purchase good quality second hand uniform (see above).
